This miniature carving is an example of the visual punning of which Alaskan Inuit artists were
particularly fond (see Nelson, 1899: 61; Fitzhugh and Kaplan, 1982: fig. 56). One view reveals a
female head with hair parted and typical chin tattoos; turned over, the neck becomes the shoulders
and head of a wolf- like creature. The neck is grooved for binding. Nelson collected a related
example of a head/bird from Cape Vancouver (Collins et al., 1973: fig. 94).
