This comb has a pair of animal heads surmounting the handle; the species is not identifiable. The shallow engraving appears on one side only and the two recesses were almost certainly for large beads, now lost. It is comparable to a comb collected by Nelson on Sledge Island, off the coast of western Alaska (see Fitzhugh and Kaplan, 1982:145). However, although Nelson collected his material between 1877 and 1881, a number of the objects, probably including the comb, were archaeological material predating the nineteenth century, which the local Inuit had found in prehistoric house foundations.
