The shortened arms held at the sides suggest that his large figure is of Punak origin. In its uprightness and simple block-like treatment the sculptor has achieved a 'monumental' effect belied by the figure's actual size. Two small holes have been drilled at the navel and there is a further hole beneath each breast. The slightly swelling breasts and abdomen, with the genital cavity, indicate a female is represented.
