Four peg holes at the top suggest that this flat-backed maskette was formerly attached to another
object. The nose is damaged, but when complete may have resembled the flukes of a whale's tail
(Ray, 1967: pl. 54, shows a mask from Point Hope with a whale fluke nose which was used in
whaling ritual).
