

## Comb with caribou image

The top of this weathered ivory comb appears to represent a young caribou without antlers. It has a slightly concave back and a simple engraved design on both sides. The small eyes are deeply drilled; four of the twelve tines are missing. Although its age is not known, it is likely to be of considerable antiquity.
