



# Breast ornament

**Title/Description:** Breast ornament

**Object Type:** Pendant

**Materials:** Clam shell, Fibre, Turtle shell

**Measurements:** h. 350 x diam. 152 x d. 40 mm

**Historic Period:** 19th/20th century

**Production Place:** Oceania, Pacific, Santa Cruz

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In this example of the *tema* breast ornament the head of the frigate bird takes the form of a fish, with seven further double fish-like elements above. Many *tema* are localised to the Graciosa Bay area of Nidu Island (also known as Ndende or Santa Cruz Island), but it is not clear where they were made, since red feathers, canoes and other valuables circulated throughout the group as part of an extensive exchange network (see Davenport, 1962: 96-7). This example most probably dates to the first part of the twentieth century, though the clam shell disc may be older.
