Johannes Milan's ceramics exude life and there is an anthropomorphic quality to this thrown lidded jar. Abstract cobalt lines and shapes animate the surface and are used by Milan as a language across his tableware (see also 50764 and 50796). Milan uses a clear nepheline glaze to bring light and depth to his slip-coated surfaces. [1]

Milan apprenticed for five years in France with Jean-Nicolas Gerard (see 50741) making slip earthenware before setting up his own studio in Germany, where he now lives and works.
