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Asymmetric rectangles and dynamic black lines have been arranged in this abstract print to create a sense of poised movement. Known primarily as a sculptor, Robert Adams regularly created and exhibited abstract prints and collages alongside his three-dimensional works. Many of his sculptures from the 1950s use thin rods and planes of sheet metal, welded together to express movement. In this print, Adams explores similar relationships between form, line and space, using colour and bold silhouetting to further the impact of his composition.

This design was screen-printed onto linen and produced as a tablemat by Porthia Prints, a company set up by the artist Denis Mitchell to circulate work by artists associated with St Ives. Thirteen selected designs were exhibited at Heal & Son Ltd in London in 1955. Other artists participating in the project included Wilhelmina Barns-Graham, Stanley Dorfman, John Forrester, Terry Frost, William Gear, Barbara Hepworth, Patrick Heron, Roger Hilton, Peter Lanyon, Denis Mitchell, Michael Snow and John Wells.
