

Architecture and the Body

Words you might find useful

Architecture: The design of buildings, or a style of building

Colossal: Very big; huge

Combination: Different things that have been put together

Complex: With lots of different parts

Depict: To show or describe something (perhaps in a drawing)

Disorienting: Confusing or baffling; making you lose your sense of direction

Elements: Parts of one thing

Expand: Make bigger or wider

Frankenstein's monster: A monster made from lots of different body parts, from a book by Mary Shelley

Fusing: Joining to make one thing

Hybrid: A mix of two or more things (often animals or plants)

Infrastructure: The things that help a system to work. In a building, these might be water pipes, electricity and internet connections

Invert: Turn around, upside down or back to front

Metamorphosis: A change from one thing to another (like a caterpillar turning into a butterfly)

Narrative: A story

Scale: Size

Sequence: a pattern or series of things that go together

Structure: Something that has been built, or something that has lots of parts put together in a special way (buildings and seashells both have structure)

Subterranean: Underground

Transformation: A big change
