



Museum Object Loan Boxes for Schools

Enrich your project on Ancient Egypt by borrowing a kit of 3D printed models of objects in our collection, complete with teachers' notes and activity sheets for your students.

We have created a set of 18 models for you to use in the classroom as part of preparation for, or follow-up to, a visit to the Centre. Equally you could use the kit as an alternative to a visit.

By handling the scale models your pupils will be able to develop their sense of connection to the real object. If they study the models alongside their interactive on-screen digital twins they will be able to see the surface of the real objects in fantastic detail. By also using our Virtual Gallery, you can see the real objects in their current home in our Living Area.

Artist Rose Feather has developed a range of activities based on the 3 different objects: Figure of a Walking Hippopotamus (306); Pantheistic Statuette (545); and Vessel in the form of the goddess Toueris (638). These will get your students looking carefully, drawing, asking questions, and thinking creatively and critically.

The box also contains instructions for making a folded 'Conversation Book' to record the experience, and information sheets about the objects, including glossaries of new vocabulary.
